

For selected course options and an extra fee (maximum £1,400), you can take an internship as an additional final term while at the College in the UK. You will:

- apply and further develop your English language skills in a professional setting

- gain additional career skills and experience and boost your CV before your degree

Students with at least UKVI IELTS 5.5:

- Speaking and Listening 2 + Speaking and Listening 3
- Study Skills Preparation
